Self Advocacy Groups

There are 8 self advocacy groups: Independence 1st, Steps, Freedom Fighters, Focus (Kidderminster College), Our Group, Friends United, Shoot for the Stars and Sideways.

Our Way's speaking up groups have had a busy year. They have worked on lots of projects, sharing views and ideas.

Self Advocacy groups meet every 3 weeks. Members support each other and are able to exchange information. They support each other to take part in community events and activities.

Members of Our Way met with Student Disability Nurses and spoke about their experiences when using the health service.



Build for the Future

Our Way members go to Build for the Future Meetings and have taken part in consultations such as Changes in Social Care, Human Rights, Employment, Hate and Crime.

Both Ways Housing Project

Both Ways is a Housing Service which supports vulnerable people to find somewhere and someone to live with in Worcestershire.

What have we done this year?

It has been a very busy year with 83 new people joining the project.


Since the project began we have supported 144 people.

We have matched 30 people.

We have supported 21 people to move into their own house, flat or bungalow.

We have supported 19 people to find support to help them keep their tenancies.

We have found 7 private landlords and 2 estate agents who are willing to work with the project and let out properties to vulnerable people.





We have also started some great partnerships with the charity, St Basils, which supports young people who are homeless.




