Shoot for the Stars

Shoot for the Stars is an Advocacy group based in Tenbury Wells. We currently have around 10 members and meet twice a month. Through discussion and interactive activities we engage with each other and discuss our opinions on the latest goings on in our lives, the local area and nationally. Meetings are held fortnightly on Wednesday evenings at Cafe 27 on Tenbury High Street.

Worcestershire Young Consulters

Our Way Worcestershire Young Consulters continue to seek and listen to the views of young people. They have been to Worcestershire schools and young people's groups to talk about transition issues, bullying, hate and mate crime. The Young Consulters have attended both the Worcestershire County Council Transition Steering Group and the Confirm and Challenge Transition Sub Group where they shared their ideas and findings.

Government cuts to benefits and NHS health care have been some of the issues talked about. Their views and ideas are reported to the National Learning Disability Forum.
