Our Way projects include:



Stars in the Sky: A friendship/dating/social project with over 100 members. The project also provides free safe relationship training.



Both Ways Housing: This aims to give disabled people the freedom and choice about where and who they live with.



DY10 Nightclub: A nightclub experience for people who have a disability over 18 years old.



Self Advocacy Groups: For young people and adults with learning disabilities across Worcestershire to get together to speak up about things important to them.

People with learning disabilities are involved in all that we do at Our Way. This includes working on our projects, being a member of the board of trustees, volunteering and six people are members of the management group.

Volunteers are very important to the success of Our Way and if you would like to join us we will give you support and training.

Both Ways is a housing matching service which supports vulnerable people to find somewhere and someone to live with in Worcestershire.

What have we done this year?

It has been a very busy year with 43 new people joining the project.

Since the project began we have supported 118 people.

We have developed our Housing Options Plan to help people think about their

- housing choices. Some of them are:Living on your own in a rented home
 - Sharing with one person or more
 - Shared ownership
 - Family buying a property and renting it to their son/daughter



- Not enough housing in the areas where people want to live.
- Not enough ground floor accommodation.
- Finding the right person to share with in the chosen area.
- Getting the right support for people to live in their own home.







We have arranged some enjoyable Both Ways Get Togethers to help people get to know each other.




Members of Both Ways took part in the My Life, My Choice events in Kidderminster and Worcester.


This chart shows where people want to live.

Stars in the Sky is a dating, friendship and social project for people with learning disabilities over 18 years old.







How does Stars in the Sky work?

You pay to become a member of Stars in the Sky. Membership is £12 if you want to join in all the events and training and £18 if you **also** want to have chaperoned/supported dates. The training workshops are about safe relationships including safe sex,drugs and alcohol information.

We organise 2/3 exciting social events every month. These include:
Karaoke, Discos, Speed Dating, Theatre Trips, Sports Events, Salsa
Dancing, Wheel Chair Dancing and DY10 Nightclub


