In the summer we worked with artists and designed and made leaves and flower for the craft forest for this year's Arts Festival in Kidderminster Town Hall.





West Midlands National Forum

Our Way representatives attend Regional Forum Meetings in Birmingham. In July Sally was elected to co-chair the meetings.

Activity Day

We joined up with students from Kidderminster College and had an activity day in the Wyre Forest.



During the summer self advocacy groups took advantage of the sunshine and met in the local park to play games and sports.



Consulters Project



We have recruited our first four Consulters!! Aaron, Chris, Rachel and Cameron will be trained and supported to find out the views, wishes and aspirations of other young people with learning disabilities in Worcestershire. They will be running forums, visiting self advocacy groups and school councils. This project is funded by BBC Children in Need.

Bush Craft Project





Eight people have completed an exciting new Bush Craft Course. The students enjoyed learning survival skills, shelter building, fire making, and cooking on a camp fire on the 6 session course which was held on Saturdays in Spetchley Woods, Worcester.

Counselling

We now have a counselling service available for our members.

Trained Counsellors Richard Lockley and Sarah Williams are providing the service. Counselling sessions last 50 minutes and members can have up to 8 weekly sessions.


